We would like to extend an invitation to you to attend the Curtis Brigham War of 1812 Gravestone Dedication being held at the above location.

Mr. Brigham has just received a new military gravestone and on this day we will honor this local hero and very important person in the history of Plainwell and Gun Plain Township, Allegan County, Michigan.

Curtis Brigham served our United States as a private in the Massachusetts Regiment of Minute Men, in Captain Tisdall's Company. Deacon Curtis Brigham is also the founder of the First Baptist Church in Plainwell, the very first church organized in Allegan County.

RALPH R. TOWNER "LAST CIVIL WAR SOLDIER" PLAQUE DEDICATION MALLORY CEMETERY, TROWBRIDGE TOWNSHIP. ALLEGAN COUNTY, MICHIGAN JULY 11th, 2009 2 PM

We at the General Benjamin Pritchard Camp 20, Department of Michigan, Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War are honored to host this dedication to honor Ralph R. Towner; the last surviving Civil War Veteran of Allegan County, Michigan.

Mr. Towner served our country in Company F of the 186 New York Infantry. He was 98 years old at his death in April of 1946.

At the time of death he was one of a few left in the Nation who attended the dedication of Gettysburg as a national memorial when President Abraham Lincoln spoke! He was also Adjutant and Quartermaster-General of Michigan Grand Army of the Republic and was a past Department of Michigan Commander of the Grand Army of the Republic, holding that office in 1945. His death left Michigan with only 3 remaining Civil War soldiers.

Mr. Towner for the last 69 years of his life was a resident on the same farm in Trowbridge Township.

Last year Camp 20 placed a "LAST CIVIL WAR SOLIDER PLAQUE" on his gravestone and we will dedicate the plaque on this day.

Mallory Cemetery is located just south of the City of Allegan, on M40.
