U. S. Grant-Detroit Home

n earlier issues of the Pritchard Press,we reported upon the planned move of the Julia and Ulysses S. Grant home from the Michigan State Fair Grounds to Detroit's Eastern Market. The fifteen mile move will begin in late July. During the first week of July the second story was temporally removed to facilitate the actual move.



Footings were poured at the new location in mid -June and final prep work should be completed and the concrete sufficiently cured to allow the move to begin by late July.



Current plans call for the home to become a museum to Grant and his impact on Detroit during his stay in the state.

Last Civil War Pensioner Dies

When Irene Triplett passed away in a North Carolina nursing home on May 31, 2020, she was the final person to receive a Civil War pension, a monthly check of \$73.13 from the Department of Veteran Affairs


She was the daughter of Mose Triplett who was 84 when Irene was born in 1930. He originally enlisted in then 53 North Carolina Infantry in May of 1862 and later transferred to the 26th North Carolina Infantry. He became ill on the March to Gettysburg. The 26th North Caro-

lina Infantry originally fielded 800 men but lost 734 killed, wounded or captured at Gettysburg. Meanwhile, Mose deserted from the Virginia hospital in 1864 and ultimately enlisted in the Union regiment the 3rd North Carolina

Mounted Infantry aka Kirk's Raiders. He passed away in 1838 at the age of 92 ,just a few days after attending the 75th anniversary of the Battle of Gettysburg.










June Camp Meeting




CAMP ACTIVITIES: GRAVES REGISTRATION

SELKIRK CEMETERY







The graves registration team searched for the Selkirk Cemetery which is listed in Wayland Township in Allegan County. After several attempts to locate the cemetery in the location listed, it was discovered that there were two pioneer gravestones in the side yard of a farmhouse marking the final resting spot of a Revolutionary War veteran and his son a War of 1812 veteran.

He was responsible for recording many Union soldiers buried in Van Buren, Kalamazoo and Allegan counties and providing that data to the Department and National databases. He has also provided numerous gravestones for soldiers whose graves went unmarked. In addition to these responsibilities, Brother Tom has been an enthusiastic supporter of all camp activities and could always be counted upon to participate in each of those events.



Recently we learned that Brother Tom has turned a hobby into an act of generosity to Michigan's outdoor enthusiasts. Over the past few winters he has carved walking sticks and then each spring he has left them along the Kal-Haven trail with the sign "Free". On a recent bicycle ride from Kalamazoo to South Have along the trail, we discovered Brother Tom's most recent gift to trail hikers. In the trail rest area where it crosses M-40 in Gobles, MI were approximately 18 of his most recent hand carved walking sticks with a sign offering them free to anyone who would like one.
